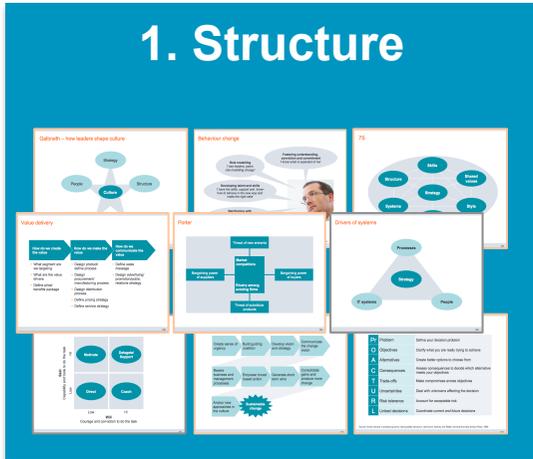

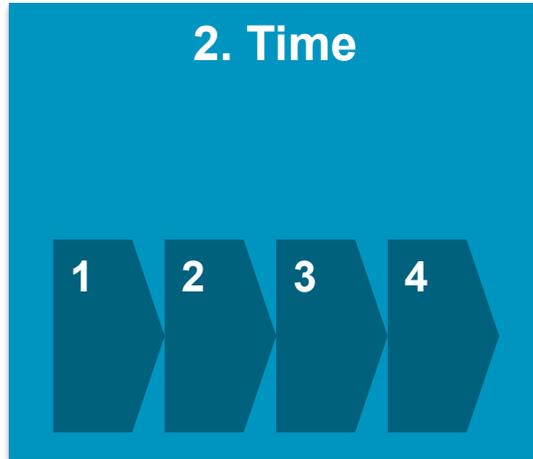

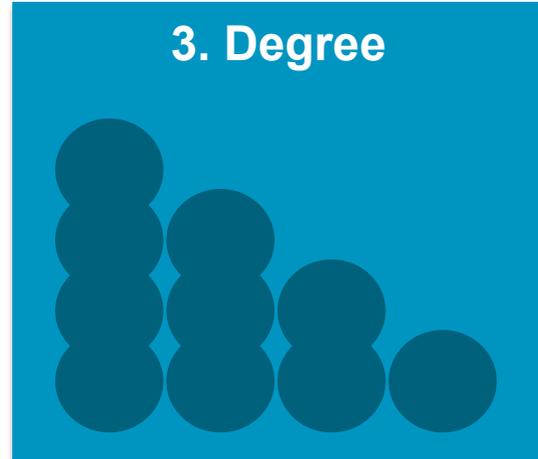
# There are three ways to order your ideas within your tree

- Components



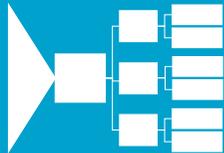
- First to last
- Last to first



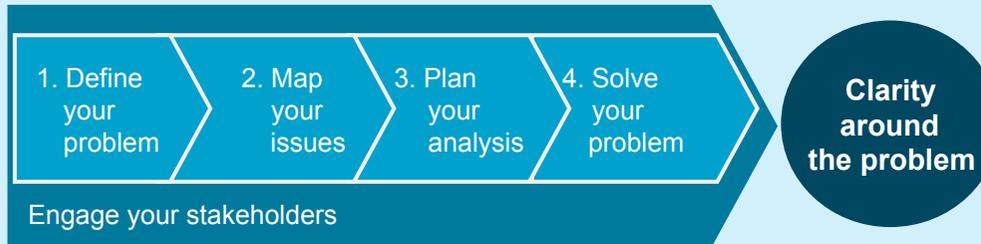
- Biggest to smallest

- Do you need to do more analysis to solve your problem?



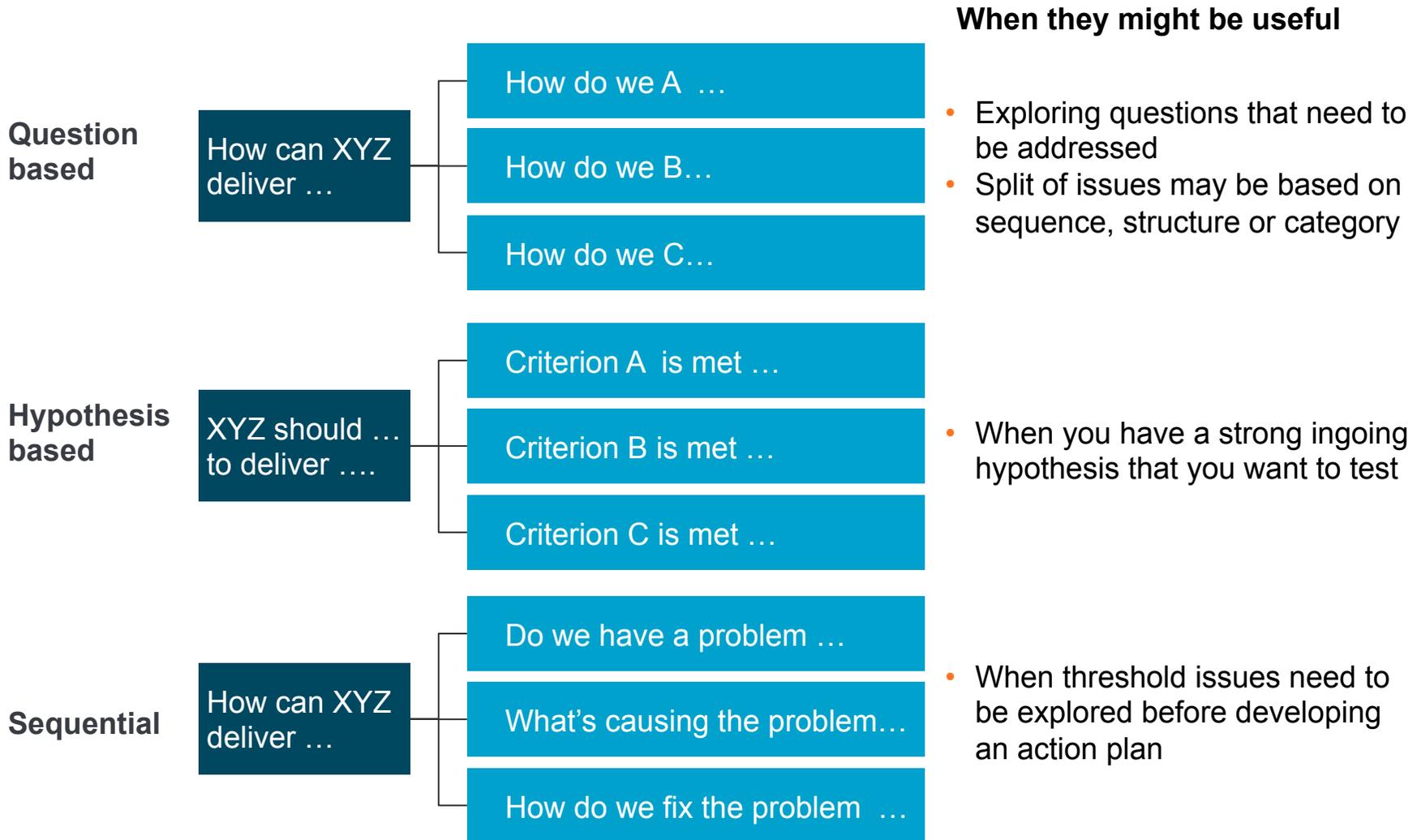
## Are you trying to clarify your thinking?



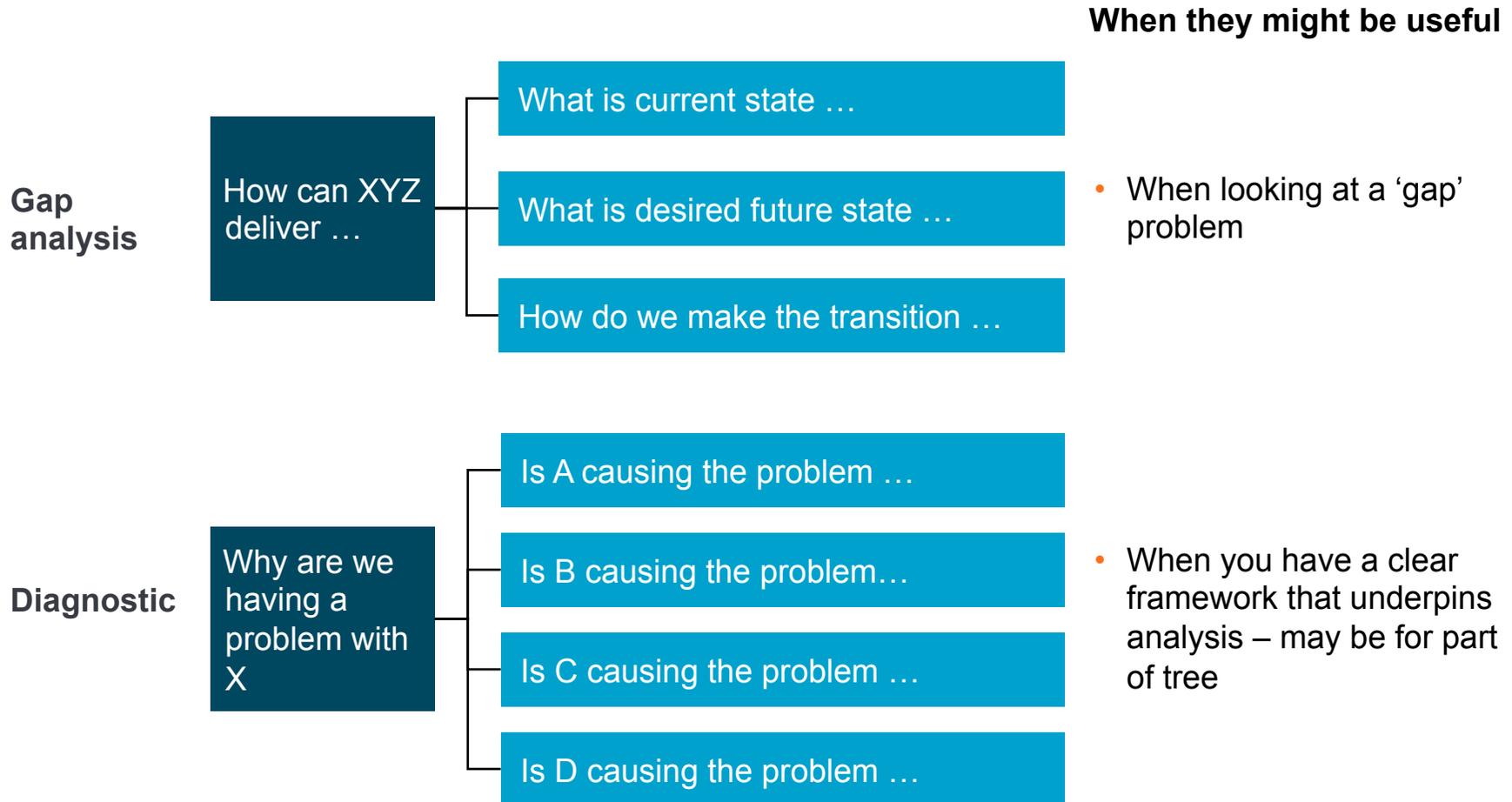
- Do you need to communicate to a particular audience?

## Five tips for building an effective issue tree

1

Pose the central question from the client's perspective

2

Articulate one idea as a full sentence in each box

3

Present the ideas in logical order within each branch or sub-branch (framework?)

4

Apply the MECE test

5

Keep it to one page: max 4 levels across and 2-5 boxes within each branch or sub-branch
